You'll learn and refine foundational construction skills, gain exposure and experience with tools and materials, and expand carpentry skills as well as interior and exterior finishing skills.

Program Details

Location: Seattle Central College's Wood Technology Center through Continuing Education

Start Date: Fall Quarter 2022. Additional start dates may be offered later in the academic year if there is demand.

Length: Three quarters

Schedule and Modality: The program will be offered in a hybrid format, with some instruction provided in-person and some provided online. Classes will be held one weekday evening and a few Saturdays beginning Fall Quarter, Wednesday, September 28.

Costs and Funding: \$1,500 per quarter. While federal financial aid is not available for this program, several construction companies might offer paid employment or pay a portion of tuition and fees.

Learning Pathway: Coursework will focus on skills and safe practices.

Program Prerequisites: There is no formal requirement or prerequisite to enroll. Basic math skills will be helpful but will be reviewed during the program. There is no college-level math requirement. A high school diploma or GED is not required for enrollment.
